1. Committee Details

Committee Name: Telangana @ 100 – Youth Vision Committee

Agenda: Youth-led Vision for Telangana in 2047

Delegates: Representatives from 5 Youth Ministries

Duration: 45–60 minutes

2. Roles

Chairperson

- Maintains order
- Opens and closes sessions
- Grants speaking time

Vice-Chairperson

- Helps maintain speaker lists
- Manages caucuses
- Tracks time

Secretary

- Reads roll call
- Maintains points and motions
- Prepares the final summary

3. 5 Youth Ministries (Delegate Roles)

Each delegate represents one “Youth Ministry of Telangana @100”:

1. **Ministry of Education & Skill Development**
2. **Ministry of Environment & Sustainable Development**
3. **Ministry of Technology, Innovation & Digital Growth**



4. **Ministry of Health, Nutrition & Well-being**
5. **Ministry of Culture, Heritage & Social Harmony**

4. Opening Script (Chairperson)

“Good morning delegates.

Welcome to the Telangana @100 – Youth Vision Committee.

Today you will present your ideas for how Telangana should look when it completes 100 years in 2047.

We will begin with Roll Call.”

5. Roll Call (Secretary)

Secretary reads:

- “Ministry of Education & Skill Development” – Present / Present & Voting
- “Ministry of Environment & Sustainable Development” – —
- “Ministry of Technology, Innovation & Digital Growth” – —
- “Ministry of Health, Nutrition & Well-being” – —
- “Ministry of Culture, Heritage & Social Harmony” – —

Chairperson: “With the roll call complete, we open the General Speakers List (GSL). Delegates may raise their placards to be added.”

6. General Speakers List – Opening Statements (1 min each)

Below are ready short speeches (adapted from your uploaded doc) that children can easily use:

1. Education & Skill Development

“In 2047, no child in Telangana should be left behind.

Every village must have digital classrooms, libraries, and skill labs.

Let education be equal, joyful, and accessible to all.”

2. Environment & Sustainability

“I dream of a Green Telangana — clean rivers, electric buses, solar schools, and youth-led Haritha Missions.

Development must never harm nature.”

3. Technology & Digital Growth

“By 2047, Telangana must be a digital leader—AI-enabled schools, smart hospitals, and tech-access for every citizen, rural and urban.”

4. Health, Nutrition & Well-being

“In Telangana @100, every citizen must have access to good doctors, mental health care, fitness programs, and nutritious food.

Health should be a right, not a privilege.”

5. Culture, Heritage & Social Harmony

“Let Telangana grow modern but stay deeply rooted—Bathukamma, Bonalu, art, language, and unity in diversity must shine even brighter in 2047.”

7. Moderated Caucus (Structured Discussion)

Chairperson’s Line:

“Delegates, we will now move to caucuses.
Are there any motions for a moderated caucus?”

Sample Moderated Caucus Motion

Delegate from Education Ministry:

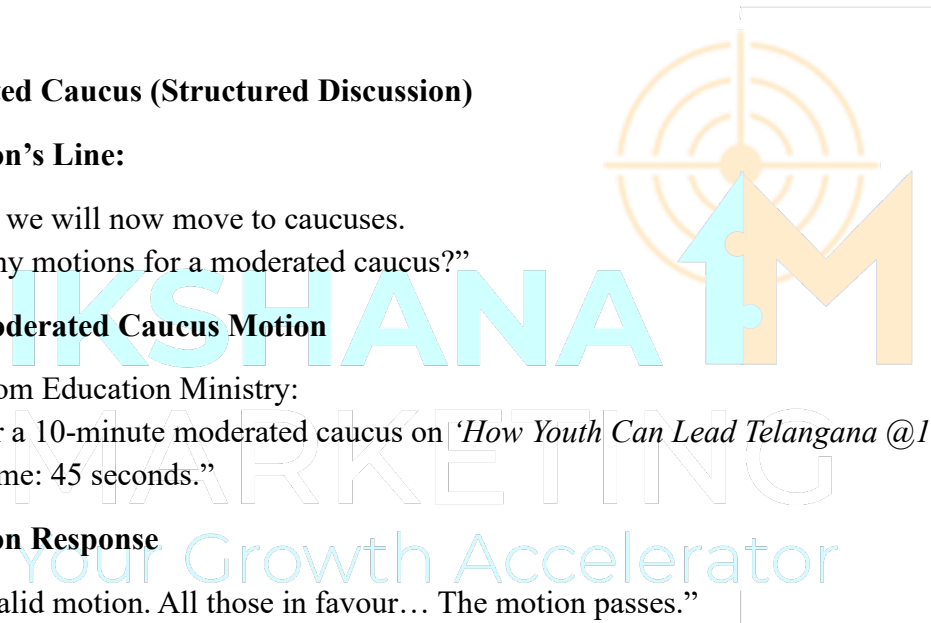
“Motion for a 10-minute moderated caucus on ‘*How Youth Can Lead Telangana @100.*’
Speaking time: 45 seconds.”

Chairperson Response

“This is a valid motion. All those in favour... The motion passes.”

Moderated Caucus – Guiding Questions

1. How can students contribute to Telangana’s development?
2. What youth-led initiatives can support education, health, or environment?
3. How can technology support rural schools?
4. What steps can students take today to build a better future?



8. Unmoderated Caucus (Free Discussion / Group Work)

Chairperson's Line:

“A motion for an unmoderated caucus is in order.”

Example Motion (Technology Ministry):

“Motion for a 7-minute unmoderated caucus to collaborate and draft a combined Telangana @100 Vision Document.”

During Unmoderated Caucus, students:

- Move around
- Combine ideas
- Help each other write
- Prepare a joint resolution

9. Draft Resolution (Final Output)

Title: *Telangana @100 – Youth Vision Resolution*

Section A – Education

- Digital smart classrooms in all schools
- Skill labs for coding, agriculture, design, and entrepreneurship
- Teacher training for new methodologies

Section B – Environment

- Mandatory sapling drive in every school
- Plastic-free campuses
- 100% rainwater harvesting and solar usage

Section C – Technology

- Digital ID for all students
- Health & Education apps for rural villages
- Innovation Clubs in every school

Section D – Health & Nutrition

- Annual health check-up for students



- Mental health counsellors in schools
- Nutrition gardens

Section E – Culture & Social Harmony

- Inter-school cultural exchanges
- Preservation of local arts and languages
- Festivals celebrated in eco-friendly ways

10. Closing Speeches (30–45 sec each)

Each Ministry shares *one* final promise they will uphold for Telangana @100.

11. Closing Script (Chairperson)

“Delegates, the committee appreciates your thoughtful vision for Telangana @100. With collaboration and responsibility, the youth can truly shape the Telangana of 2047. This session is now adjourned.”



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
