

B) Student Notes – Toolkit Page

1. What Are “Groups & Consultations”?

- It’s how delegates **team up to solve a problem**.
- First you **speak**, then you **discuss and write together**, then you **present**.

2. Two Kinds of Caucus

- **Moderated:** Speak one by one (30–45 sec).
- **Unmoderated:** Move, meet, write together.

3. How to Join a Group

1. Walk to the group that matches your idea.
2. Say your one clear point.
3. Volunteer as notetaker or speaker.

4. What to Write

- A **title** (e.g., “Joint Plan for Clean Water in Schools”)
- **3–5 action points** (simple and doable)
- Names of your group’s countries at the end.

5. Good Habits

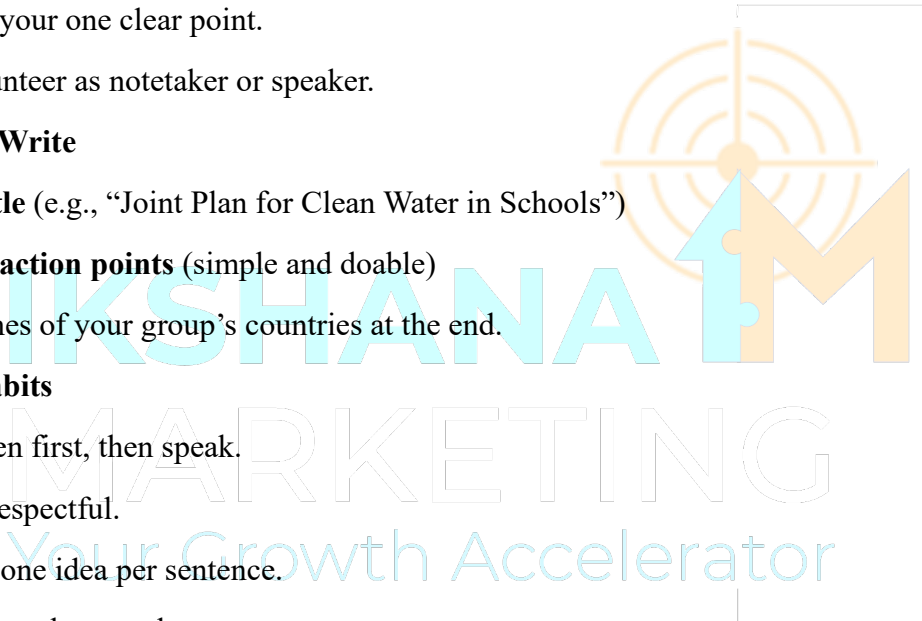
- Listen first, then speak.
- Be respectful.
- Use one idea per sentence.
- Invite others to share.

6. Sample Script (30–45s)

“Honourable Chair, I represent [Country]. We propose [1 clear action] because [why it matters]. Thank you.”

C) Orientation Practice Activity (10–12 min)

1. **Prompt:** “Reduce water-borne illness in 3 months.”
2. 5 min Moderated Caucus (30s per speaker).



3. 6 min Unmoderated Caucus – draft 3 action points in 2 groups.
4. Share back – 1 min per group.
5. Wrap – merge top 4–6 points into one Joint Action Plan.

Skill	What We Look For
Listening	Waits turn, responds to ideas
Clarity	Uses short sentences & clear actions
Teamwork	Shares roles & space
Focus	Sticks to topic & time
Constructive	Builds and improves ideas

E) Joint Action Plan Template

Title: Joint Action Plan on [Topic]

G) Suggested Video Message Script (2–3 min)

Tone: Warm, encouraging, simple

Visuals: Students speaking, placards, small group huddles, smiling judges

Subtitles: English + Telugu

1. Welcome (15s): “Welcome to iVision 2025. You are the voice of your country.”
2. What happens (30s): “You’ll share your idea in short speeches, then work together to write a joint plan.”
3. Moderated vs Unmoderated (30s): “Moderated = one-by-one speaking. Unmoderated = move and write together.”
4. How to contribute (40s): “Join a group, listen first, add one clear action.”
5. Success (30s): “Success means a joint plan with practical actions.”
6. Close (15s): “Be confident, kind, and curious. See you at iVision 2025.”

Overlay Text:

- “One idea. One sentence.”
- “Listen → Build → Agree.”
- “From speech to solution.”
- Telugu: “మీ ఆలోచనలు ప్రపంచాన్ని మార్చగలవు. iVision 2025లో కలుద్దాం!”
