2. Committee Allotment Criteria

S.No.	Criteria	Description	Example
1	Student Interest & Strength	Allot based on student's preferred area (Global, National, or State)	A student who loves global issues → UN Committee
2	Language Confidence	Allot committees where the student can express clearly (English / Hindi / Telugu)	Confident speaker → Indian Parliament Committee
3	Balanced Representation	Each school should distribute students across committees	Max. 2 students per committee per school
4	Equitable Distribution	Each committee should have representation from multiple schools and mandals	8–10 schools per committee
5	Performance at School Level	Short speech or paragraph writing can be used to shortlist	Top scorer gets first choice
6	Equal Gender Representation	Encourage balanced participation	Minimum 40% girls
7	Teacher Nomination	Teachers finalize allotment to maintain balance and mentoring	Nomination sheet signed by teacher & principal

4. Allotment Rules of Thumb

- Max. **2 students per school per committee** at Mandal level.
- Each committee must have **representation from at least 4–5 schools**.
- Students should **receive their committee & representation slip** at registration.
- Gender balance to be maintained.
- Late allotments should be filled only if a seat is vacant.

5. Implementation Flow for Committee Allotment

1. **School-level Orientation** → Students choose preferred committee.
2. **Teacher Shortlisting** → Based on confidence, interest, and language.
3. **Mandal-level Pooling** → Balancing numbers across committees.
4. **Final Allotment** → Generated by Ikshana Master Sheet.
5. **Distribution** → Committee & role slips + ID badges handed out on event day.
